The Whitingham Selectboard held a regular meeting at 6:30pm in the Selectboard Office of the Whitingham Municipal Center on Wednesday, April 19, 2023.

Selectboard members present: Scott M. Reed, Chair; James Weber, Vice Chair; Craig Hammer, and Robin Kingsley.

Call to Order. Additions or Changes to Agenda

Scott M. Reed called the meeting to order at 6:30pm. Changes to the agenda were noted on the meeting copy.

<u>Hearing of visitors (for concerns not on the agenda)</u> None.

Highway Garage: review engineer's site plan suggestion(s)

Brud Sanderson presented four options for proposed garage after doing a topographic survey and confirming wetlands/river rules. There are wetlands on the property but not in the area of any the proposed improvements. All options were discussed. The board leaned towards option 1. Mr. Janovsky would like time to consider all the options, do some measuring, etc.

Highway: open paving and gravel bids

Gravel:

Cersosimo 1" shoulder material- not gravel, bid tossed out Zaluzny 1" minus crushed gravel delivered \$32 per cubic yard Pike Industries ¾ gravel delivered \$25.86 per ton; approx \$38.79 per cubic yard Mitchell Materials/Allstates 1" minus crushed gravel delivered \$18.70 per ton, approximately \$28.05 per cubic yard.

Scott M. Reed made a motion to award Mitchell/Allstates the paving and gravel bids, seconded by James Weber, all in favor. Pike offered a slightly lower price, but the board wasn't happy with the paving they did last year.

Sewer: discuss resident using our engineers for a sewer connection

The property owner of 62 Brickhouse Road would like to connect to the sewer system. They have contacted Weston & Sampson Engineers to design the connection. W&S is the engineering firm in charge of our sewer upgrades project. The property owner wanted to make sure the Selectboard didn't feel it was a conflict of interest. The board is fine with that.

Hazard Mitigation: review contractor proposals to update LHMP

We have a grant to update our Local Hazard Mitigation Plan, proposals were due today. We received six:

<u>Discuss creating a town Facebook account</u> The board approved trying social media (Facebook, Twitter and/or Instagram) to share information about local events and emergency situations. The main filing of public information will continue to be the town website. Gig does not plan to post agendas or minutes on social media. If public comments get ugly, we can shut these accounts down.
