This dignified process mirrors nature's own cycle of renewal, where organic matter naturally returns to the earth to nourish new life.

The process takes place in a specially designed vessel called the Chrysalis™, where a loved one's remains are carefully placed on a bed of natural materials including straw, alfalfa, and wood chips. Over 28 to 33 days, beneficial microorganisms facilitate the transformation process, creating approximately one cubic yard of fertile soil that families can use to plant trees, enrich gardens, or donate to conservation projects. Natural Organic Reduction has been legal in VT since January 1, 2023.

The NOR/Terramation Process



The Laying-In Ceremony

A loved one is placed on a bed of straw, alfalfa and wood chips in a Chrysalis Vessel™, often accompanied by love notes and/or family provided organics.



Precision-Controlled Transformation

The sealed vessel maintains optimal airflow, moisture and temperature. A biologic catalyst enhances the natural process, with intermittent rotation stimulating transformation.



Process Completion

In 28-33 days, the body is transformed into Regenerative Living Soil™. The soil is sifted to remove inorganics, and bones are reduced to powder and reintegrated.



30-Day Curing

The soil rests for 30 days allowing bioactivity to slow and cool naturally.



Soil Returned or Donated

Approximately 1 cubic yard of soil is returned to family in 25-pound bags for planting, gardening or other lifesustaining purposes.


